

Yap Stone Money Fact Sheet

Yap Stones, also known as Rai stones, are large stone disks used as money on the island of Yap in Micronesia.

Key Facts:

- Made from limestone.
- Some stones are up to 4 meters in diameter.
- Ownership was determined by social agreement, not physical movement.
- The history of a stone influenced its value.

Lesson: Currency value depends on community trust and agreed systems, not just the object itself.
